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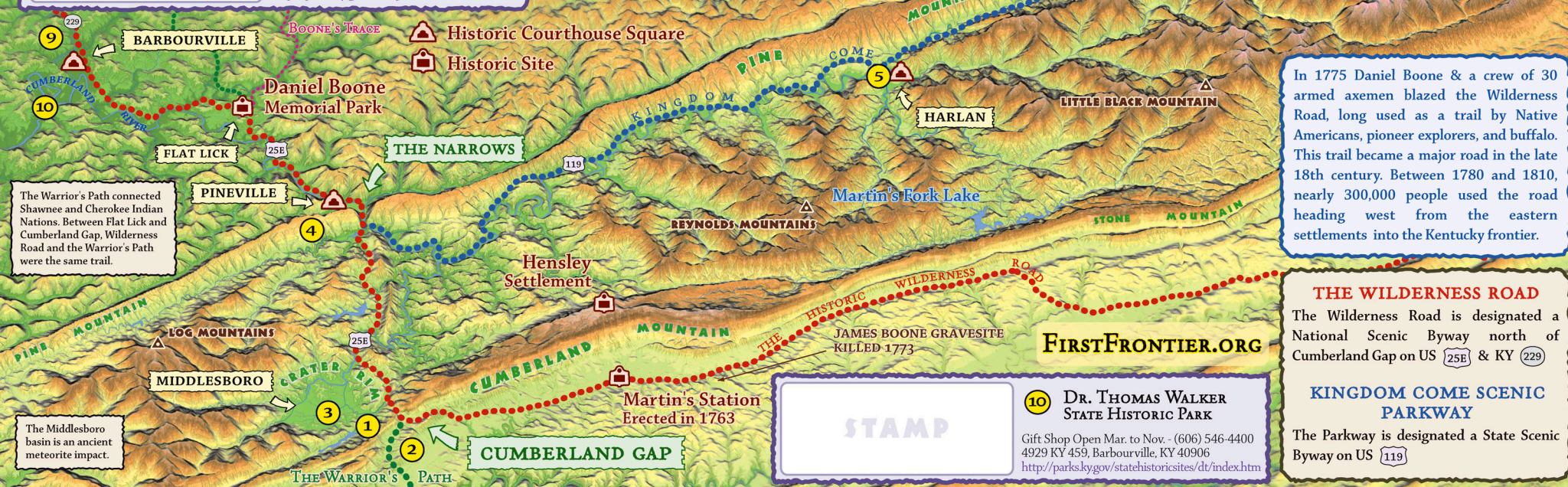

The Cumberland River cuts through Pine Mountain at the Narrows. This pass was as important as Cumberland Gap in the settlement of Kentucky.

1 PASSPORT PIT-STOP



In 1775 Daniel Boone & a crew of 30 armed axemen blazed the Wilderness Road, long used as a trail by Native Americans, pioneer explorers, and buffalo. This trail became a major road in the late 18th century. Between 1780 and 1810, nearly 300,000 people used the road heading west from the eastern settlements into the Kentucky frontier.

THE WILDERNESS ROAD

The Wilderness Road is designated a National Scenic Byway north of Cumberland Gap on US 25E & KY 229

KINGDOM COME SCENIC PARKWAY

The Parkway is designated a State Scenic Byway on US 119
